## 3. COURSE DESCRIPTION

The seminar will focus on Euripides' *Bacchae* with the aim to explore the special characteristics of the play, its 'dialogue' with other Dionysiac dramas, its mythico-ritual texture, basic issues of relation with its historical context, and some forms of its modern reception.

An introduction to the general subject of study will be provided by the tutor; methodological issues will also be analyzed and topics of papers assigned.

Participants will be expected:

To study thoroughly the particular topic chosen for investigation To find and study the relevant bibliography To present their topic orally and answer questions To write an academic paper on the topic .
