BROAD KNOWLEDGE/COMPETENCIES

The course is intended for students with little or no previous knowledge of Modern Greek, introducing them to the language within its cultural context. The course is mainly communicative, encouraging oral interaction in everyday situations. At the same time, it highlights the fundamentals of the Modern Greek grammar (grammar points explained in English). Students are introduced to aspects of the Greek culture on several occasions. By the end of the course, students will be able to communicate successfully at a basic level:

Writing: The student can write an elementary short text such as an e-mail, a note, a letter, or fill a form with personal information.

Reading: The student can read short texts provided they are based on the grammar and the vocabulary of the level.

Speaking: The student can express basic needs, give brief descriptions or hold an everyday conversation on one of the topics taught in class.

Listening: The student can understand clear messages and announcements, as long as the

other person is ready to repeat or rephrase something. COURSE DESCRIPTION

- Working with texts; The aim is to familiarize students with the target vocabulary and grammar, and develop reading and listening skills.
- Classroom conversation, based on the text and/or relevant scenarios: Students are encouraged to practice with the target vocabulary and grammar, and develop speaking.
- Short assignments to be presented in class: Students are required (individually or in a team) to produce a text, developing further speaking and writing.
- Depending on the cultural relevance of each topic discussed, additional information is given to develop the students' cultural awareness.
