- recognize basic structural parts and typical scenes of Aristophanic Comedy
- -assess the special position Assemblywomen has in Aristophanes' whole comic production
- understand and appreciate the comic language and the linguistic registers used in the play
- know and use the basic bibliography on Aristophanes.
