## 3. COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course will introduce students to the poetry of Late Antiquity and will provide an overview of the *Dionysiaca* and the *Paraphrasis*, which will bring close the epic production of the era and Nonnus' eccentric methods of composition. The course will focus on selected episodes of the *Paraphrasis* and the *Dionysiaca* laying emphasis on the phenomenon of resurrection as well as the incorporation of "pagan" and Christian features in each of the poems.
