(3) SYLLABUS

The seminar is divided into two parts.

In Part I, the instructor will deliver a series of lectures on the follow main topics: The cultural specificity of the Ionian area Social stratification and its literary-cultural imprint - the consolidation of Venetian domination through the diffusion of the Venetian world view from the 17th century onwards. - Examples of 'Germanism' in the 19th century. **Romantic poetics** The Athenaeum magazine Walter Benjamin and the Concept of Art Criticism in German Romanticism Formation of a new field of discourse: the critique 'Critical poetry' and Solomos' Stochasmoi- the case of Emmanuel Stais - lakovos Polylas and his 'Prolegomena' - the case of Georgios Kalosgouros The work of Spyridon Zambelios Translation and cultural transfer The example of Shakespeare: dissemination and impact in the Ionian area Continuities and ruptures Athenian critics of Solomos and the Ionian criticism of the successors Constantinos Asopios at the University of Athens and the "philological criticism" according to Wolf.

In Part II, each student will orally present a paper on the specific topic chosen by herself/himself.
