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1. Résumé

Maria Papadopoulou is Assistant Professor in Digital Humanities and Classics at the University of Crete (2024 -). She is also the Project Manager and Research Group Leader of the European project ERA Chair TALOS: Artificial Intelligence for the Humanities and the Social Sciences (TALOS AI4SSH) (2023 - 2028). She is the first Faculty in Digital Humanities in Greece. She previously served as the first Laboratory Teaching Staff in Digital Humanities in Greece at the Department of Educational Studies of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA) (2022).

Maria Papadopoulou has been an associate researcher at the LISTIC laboratory at the University Savoie Mont Blanc in France since 2017. As a member of the LISTIC laboratory and convenor of the Condillac International Research Group on Terminology and Ontology, which is in charge of the TOTH conferences on «Terminology and Ontology: Theories and application (TOTH)», she has undertaken initiatives related to the research and teaching of Semantic Web standards for humanists.

She is visiting professor at both the Department of Computer Science at Liaocheng University in China (2017 -) and the Department of Foreign Languages at Nanjing University of Aeronautics and Astronautics (NUAA) (2023 -). In addition, she is an active member of the Knowledge Engineering and Terminology Research Centre (KETRC), Liaocheng University (China). Her research and teaching activities in China include initiatives for the digitalization of the ancient Greek and Chinese cultural heritage.

Maria Papadopoulou studied Classical Philology at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA), where she earned her bachelor's degree in 1991. She then pursued a master's degree in Linguistics at Lancaster University (UK) from 1993 to 1994. After completing her postgraduate studies, Maria Papadopoulou returned to NKUA to pursue a PhD in Classical Philology, focusing on Hellenistic Poetry. She successfully defended her dissertation and received her doctoral degree in 2011. To validate her digital skills in Semantic Web technologies and bridge them with her expertise in Classical studies, as of June 2021, she is pursuing a second PhD in Digital Classical Studies at the University of Savoie Mont Blanc.

From 1998 to 2013, Maria Papadopoulou worked on two research projects, AMITOS and ELLINIKOS LOGOS of the Academy of Athens, Centre for the Study of Modern Greek Dialects and Idioms. During this time, she focused on studying and preserving modern Greek language varieties. In 2001, after passing rigorous examinations, she was tenured as a teacher in Secondary Education but continued to carry out her research duties at the KENDI as a seconded employee.

In 2013 and 2014 she was seconded to work at the headquarters of the Greek Ministry of Education. Following a positive evaluation by the Development Programmes Management Organisation Unit (MOU S.A.) of the Ministry of Economy and Finance, she joined the staff of the Lifelong Learning Operational Programme at the Greek Ministry of Education. There, she was responsible for monitoring and providing administrative support to EU co-funded academic research projects throughout their life cycle, as well as promoting best practices.

Between 2015-2017 she worked as a research and teaching staff at the Saxo Institute of the University of Copenhagen having earned a prestigious Marie Curie Individual Fellowship of the European Commission with the project «Chlamys: the cultural biography of a garment in Hellenistic Egypt». At the University of Copenhagen, she taught undergraduate and

postgraduate courses in the field of Hellenistic History and conducted interdisciplinary research in Classical Studies with a focus on the Alexandrian period and Ptolemaic Egypt.

She has co-supervised PhD students, served on doctoral dissertation committees, and mentored undergraduate, graduate, doctoral, and postdoctoral students. She has published over forty scientific papers in international journals, edited volumes, and peer-reviewed conference proceedings, mostly in English. She has also published in Greek and French, and her research has been translated into Chinese. She has presented the findings of her research at international conferences in over twenty countries and participated in outreach activities for the public at large. She has co-authored the book «21st c. Skills and Digital Humanities» (in Greek, ISBN 978-960-485-519-3) and translated two textbooks, one of which has been the main textbook in the field of Adult Education in Greece for the last twenty years. Her scientific interests include Classics, Artificial Intelligence (AI) applications for Digital Humanities (DH), Knowledge Representation and Modeling, Knowledge Graphs, Semantic Web standards, Ontologies, Linked Open Data.

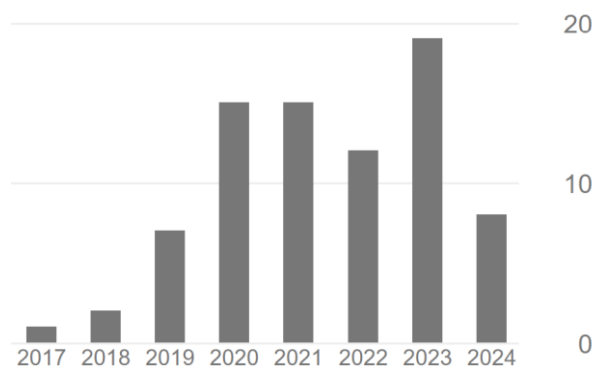
